## POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

*All members are required to sign in upon entering the pool area.*

*Guests must be accompanied by a TCC member at all times.*

*Guest Fees: \$2.00 per person on weekdays & \$3.00 per person on weekends/holidays.*

### GENERAL

- No coolers, picnic baskets, thermoses or glass containers in pool area.
- No food, candy, or chewing gum allowed in pool.
- No diving into pool.
- No running, jumping, or gymnastic stunts into the pool.
- Foul language, inappropriate behavior, or disregard for rules will not be tolerated.
- No person suffering from a communicable disease shall use the pool.
- No person under the influence of alcohol or drugs shall be allowed in the pool area.
- The pool will be cleared at the threat of thunder and/or lightning.
- No radios without headphones.
- Towels are provided for use at the pool and may not be removed from the premises.
- Children under the age of 16 are required to use the junior locker rooms.
- For safety reasons and insurance coverage, members and their guests are not allowed to enter the pool at times it is not open with lifeguards on duty.
- **Children (under the age of 12) must be supervised by a parent or responsible adult other than by a Club employee.**

### DRESS CODE

- Appropriate attire is required.
- No regular diapers allowed in the pool.
- “Little Swimmer” (water safe) diapers are required.
- While in swim attire, persons are not allowed to enter the upper level of the clubhouse, the Pro Shop or use the golf course and practice facilities.

### FLOTATION DEVICES / SAFETY

- All toys and water accessories must be approved by pool staff.
- Squirt guns and toy balls, while allowed, may be restricted based on size and pool occupancy.
- Infant flotation seats allowed with parent in-pool assistance.
- Life saving flotation devices (water wings, life jackets, swim suits with sewn-in foam blocks) are allowed, but may be restricted based on pool occupancy.
- Safety devices must be appropriately fitted.
- Safety flotation devices are not a substitute for parent in-pool assistance.
- **Parent (or guardian) must be in arms reach of non-swimmers at all times.**  
(Any child in flotation device is considered a non-swimmer.)
